LENT APPEAL - OPEN DOORS

This week, the Ethos Group finalised their planning of our Lenten Appeal.

Following our Courageous Advocate worship on Brother Andrew, the founder of **Open Doors**, the children were inspired to consider justice and freedom for Christians, and people of other faiths, who are being treated badly (often imprisoned) for practising their faith.

The Ethos Group decided we will dress up in the colours of Open Doors on Friday 22nd March – children may wear something **purple or white** in exchange for £1. Tom (a valued member of our Ethos group) is designing a game, based on opening doors, which the children can play for 50p a go.

Each child will also write a prayer for those people /countries where people do not have freedom to believe. They will write these on a key, which we will hang in our Outdoor Reflection Area.
