I'm sure you have all heard about the changes being made by government in trying to keep children safe online. This is something we take incredibly seriously at Lea Endowed. Children should be able to access safe online spaces, in order to benefit from all the opportunities that a connected world can bring to them, in an age-appropriate way. Sadly, we have recently had several concerning accounts, including from some of our youngest children, about the things they have access to online, at home. It is our absolute responsibility, as adults, to protect our children from what they see and hear. In school we have strict monitoring and filtering systems for our online technology however, the children are still monitored carefully by staff, when using the internet. We strongly recommend that you check your children's online activities daily and ensure you have strict parental controls set up on every digital device they can access. Please also be aware of online behaviours outside of the family home eg when visiting friends and family.

We invest heavily in subscribing to National College, a "Multi-Award-Winning platform in Online Safety Education for the Whole School Community." They provide online safety education, training, and updates for staff, parents and governors. It is really user friendly, and I cannot emphasise enough how invaluable it is to know how to protect our children in this way. ## **Good Mental Health**

Last week, on 19<sup>th</sup> September, we celebrated Youth
Mental Health Day.

Mental health concerns for young people have multiplied in recent times. Today, 1 in 6, 5-16-year olds have a diagnosable mental health disorder, with 6 in 10 young people saying they are experiencing mental health difficulties such as anxiety, low mood, eating disorders, and self-harming behaviours.

By getting young people engaged in discussions and activities about how to improve their mental health, YMHD goes beyond raising awareness and breaking the stigma surrounding mental health. It aims to tackle the heart of the issue by giving young people a voice and agency to take steps towards positive mental health.

With this in mind, I have added a "Parent Guide - Keeping Stress in Check" to our Mental Health & wellbeing tab on the school website. Please check out some great hints and tips to support your child and yourself in caring for your own mental health.
