### In Class

This week we have been doing a lot of deep thinking.

On Monday, we enjoyed watching the Year 6 Remembrance Day Service which made us think really hard about the impact of conflict. We read a thought-provoking poem called 'Take A Stand', and made our own reflections on the meaning of Remembrance Day. Then on Tuesday, we tuned into a live assembly on Anti-Bullying Week and discussed the central theme of Respect. We were very grown up in talking about what respect is and how we show respect. The children wrote some fabulous acrostic poems, sharing all that they had learned. In Maths, we have been learning how to exchange in column subtraction and applying this to some tricky problem solving. We will revisit this concept next term. Miss Wilson taught us all about Viking longhouses in History and we compared them to our own houses.
