Hello to you all, what a fabulous few weeks we have had in Class 4. In maths, we have been calculating perimeter and the area of rectangles, including compound shapes. It was a real "light bulb" moment with Area this week with Y5, which has been wonderful to see. Y4 have been comparing Area and calculating Area using squares. In English we finished our unit on "The Highwayman" and the children wrote some fantastic poems in the style of Alfred Noyes. We have been researching and writing all about areas in France to create a persuasive leaflet. Their challenge is to convince Miss Turner to book her next adventure in their region of France! In Science we have been looking at dissolving, and how sugar changes state, investigating whether the size of the granules affects the time it takes to dissolve in the water. In RE, we have been reading about a man called Zacchaeus and how Jesus changed his life forever. We have been considering how reading and learning about Jesus can change our lives and have a significant impact upon the lives of Christians.
