## In Class

We are all settling well into our new routines and, for the Year 3 children, finding out about being a junior! Thank you to the parents who were able to attend the Welcome Meeting last week, where I was able to share some key information about Class 3. Please refer to the website for the notes from this meeting, as well as our half term overview and Autumn class targets. It is often a giant leap forward, with different expectations and responsibilities and I am very proud of the way the children have managed this so far. In class, we are reading Charlotte’s Web and doing many related writing activities. The children are really enjoying the story and are able to identify key information in the text as well as inferring information from the context of the story. We have been looking at numbers to 10,000 in our Maths and using a lot of equipment to help us, including Base 10, place value counters and place value charts. In our Science, we have been classifying animals and have started our gymnastics unit in PE. Ask your child to show you the ‘Rubber Chicken’ warm up which we have loved doing as part of our Music sessions!
