In Class

Welcome back to a new term – we came back in the ice and snow but, hopefully, we will soon start to see signs of new life and Spring in our gardens, school grounds and local environment. The children returned to school well rested, and all seem to have enjoyed their Christmas break and all the joy and festivities it brought with it! We have started our new units of work, all detailed on our Class Overview, which is available on the website if you would like to take a look. The children have been exploring world and European maps to identify France and some of the main human and physical features of the country. Try asking them about the capital city, bordering countries and continent. The children have also been working with the 8 points of the compass. In our English, we have been looking at poetry and using familiar models to write our own (rhyming) poems. The innovated poems have been excellent, and some really made me smile! We have had a short unit investigating

Area in Maths and have now moved back to Multiplication and Division, finding factors and multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100. We have been thinking about change in our RE, how our lives have changed and how Jesus did, and does, change peoples' lives.

Swimming

Starting on the 20th January, we are going swimming every day for a 2-week period. This will be after lunch and the children will return to school before the end of the school day.
