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In Class

The children have been writing their own chapter of Charlotte's Web this week. I have been impressed with their work, and their writing stamina has improved so much in such a short period of time! We have used conjunctions, adjectives and detail from the original text which takes a little juggling alongside handwriting, spelling, punctuation and vocabulary choices!! In our Maths, we have moved away from place value and are now focusing on addition and subtraction, including adding 1s, 10s, 100s and 1000s across boundaries. For this, the children need a really secure knowledge of number bonds to 10 and 20 – if you are able, please keep practising at home with this. We have continued our work on habitats in Science, looking at the animals which live in a woodland habitat, and also looking at all the unique features a camel possesses to allow it to survive in the desert. Miss Wilson has been discussing the positives and negatives of tourism in the Lake District and the children have begun to create their own tourist leaflets, enticing people to visit Lake Windermere! Today in our RE, we have looked again at the Jewish festival of Sukkot and have built our own sukkahs, looking closely at their features to include in our design.
