In Class 3, we have been researching Mary Seacole, a Victorian doctress, who, despite being turned away several times, travelled to Crimea and helped thousands of injured and sick soldiers fighting in the War. Did you know that there is now a wonderful statue of Mary Seacole outside St Thomas' Hospital in London, erected in 2016 and unveiled by Floella Benjamin, another heroine who our reception children told us all about in our special presentation. In Maths this week, we have been tackling column addition and learning to exchange across columns when the total is greater than 9. The children have made a really good start with this and will continue to practise next week.
