Class 3 have enjoyed our Science work this half term, focusing on Sound. The children have made ear defenders and string telephones, and hypothesised about whether distance from a sound source affects the volume.



The children loved their History topic on the Vikings. They learnt about the gruesome raids at Lindisfarne and all about life as a Viking, including the houses they lived in, the clothes they wore and their reasons for moving to England in the first place. The children made some amazing shields and swords and took their mock battle with Class 4 VERY seriously! Mrs Seagrave and I feared for our lives as we watched them take position and pull their best warrior face!!

PNE have been working with us all half term on a Monday afternoon. Logan has been teaching us Flag Football, and commented on the children's enthusiasm. Regardless of how good the children are at Flag Football, we are always instilling good sportsmanship and collaboration, which are important life skills, both on and off the pitch.
