Class News

Class 5 have hit the ground running after the Christmas and New Year break, quickly getting back into our established routines. A new term brings new topics for the children to enjoy: Extreme Weather is the theme for Geography which is working well with our English unit where we are learning about Sir Ernest Shackleton's Antarctic adventures. They spoke very differently back in 1914, so we have spent a good amount of time immersing ourselves in new vocabulary while also learning to use the 'subjunctive form' (ask your child what this is!).

In Maths we have been focusing on ratio and proportion – something that we use a great deal in everyday life whether baking or map reading. The children have learnt the, 'make a table' strategy to organise the information and we are next going to apply this to scaling recipes up and down.

This week we had a visit from WPC's Abby and Ruth who talked to Year 5 and 6 children about the rise in knife crime. Did you know that carrying a knife without an acceptable reason carries a prison sentence of up to 4 years? The children showed good understanding of the key messages from the talk which we pray will keep them safe through their teenage years.
