Class News

This term seems to be moving very quickly, probably due to how busy Class 5 have been lately!

Whilst we are working hard, we are also making the most of our PE time to build fitness and functional movement skills. This term we are fortunate to have Michael, a very capable coach from PNE who has kept the children engaged and out-of-breath for the entirety of their lessons! I was pleased to hear him say that Class 5 were extremely responsive to his questions and already knew many of the basketball passes and movements.

In Maths we have built on our understanding of area to include knowing the formula for finding the area of a triangle and parallelogram while, in English, we have been developing ideas for a monologue.

As we are in Lent, the children have been interpreting who Jesus said He was by reading John's Gospel. They all thought deeply about his words to develop their own thinking around ideas such as 'I am the vine...' and 'I am the gate...'

We finished the British Science Week by learning more about how animals and plants can change and adapt over time to suit their environments. The children used their researching skills to create a class fact file on some amazing animals. My favourite was definitely the 'Mountain Chicken', which is actually a highly adapted frog!
