## **Class News**

We have been working super hard on a range of topics in Class 5 over the past two weeks. In Science we learnt about helpful and harmful micro-organisms before setting up individual investigations to identify the best conditions for growing mould on bread. After a slow start, the children's observations were quickly a highpoint of the day as their bread became host to some exotically coloured organisms! Warm, damp and dark conditions were a common theme.

Algebra has been our focus in Maths and we have got to grips with algebraic expressions and formulas – the latter introducing the children to the maths involved in calculating the cooking time for a roast chicken. Maybe you can ask your child to set the timer the next time you have a roast!

In English we have used the subjunctive form with a good dose of persuasive language to apply for a position on Shackleton's Antarctic Expedition. If the finished letters are to be believed, we have some of the strongest, most resilient and experienced explorers in Year 6!
