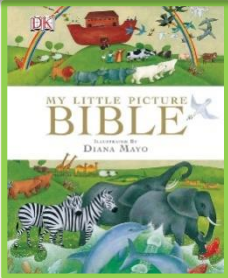
"Let your light shine." Matthew 5:16
