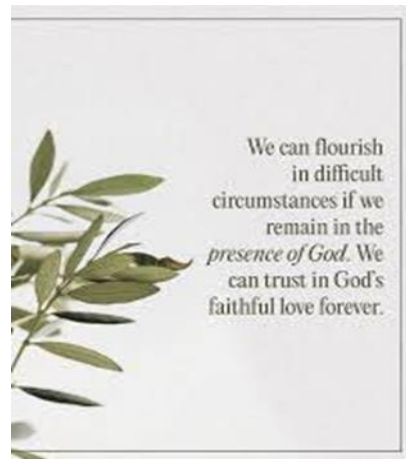


In Class
